Our Roswell Club will be embarking on a special trip to Tallulah Falls School. This excursion is designed to enhance our understanding of our organization and its history. During




the trip, members will have the unique opportunity to tour the school and visit the State office, gaining valuable knowledge of the history of GFWC Georgia.

February's Meeting and a Meal

During our volunteer work at CHOA, we discovered a heartwarming way to bring joy not only to the children but also to their parents. It became evident that the parents were just as enthusiastic about the crafts as their little ones. In fact, some parents asked us if they could take a craft back to their rooms, as it is a wonderful way to pass the time while awaiting discharge.

During our February meeting, six members took the initiative to create special craft kits intended for both parents and children. Each kit was thoughtfully put together, containing all the necessary materials along with a QR code linking to a helpful How-To video. In total, we assembled 30 of these kits to distribute to families at CHOA and/or Ronald McDonald House.











March 9th - North West District Meeting at the Atlanta Woman's Club

We had a wonderful time at our District meeting. It is always so nice to meet others from across our district. Our district meeting had 75 ladies in attendance and a great time was had by all!.







I have been in contact with Simple Needs Georgia.



She has invited us to visit their warehouse on a Saturday for a tour and/or help out - 10am to 1pm almost every Saturday accepting donations. We can discuss this at our meeting.

Below are lots of ideas for service projects. Several are higher priority than others.

Current top needs are (see below for details on some):

- Women's underwear (sizes 6-9 are most needed)
- Small appliances
- baby items
- school supplies (we have plenty of some; need others)
- New standard bed pillows
- new character backpacks (we can give you the character list if that helps)

She provided us with a few service project ideas:

- A few possibilities for our birthday program https://simpleneedsgablog.com/programs/my-birthday-matters/
- A new book drive. For their birthdays, each child receives 4-5 new books for their birthday (depends on their age/grade). We help kids up to age 18.
- A new backpack drive. We can use character backpacks as well as popular color backpacks. Our inventory right now is lowest for larger backpacks for high school kids (larger bottoms to hold more things). We also need a few themes; let us know if you want to do backpacks and I can let you know what we need (we track which themes are popular - and not).
- School supplies which we include with the birthday gifts. Gallon ziplock bags of: 5 pens, 5 pencils, box of crayons (24 or 36), box of colored pencils (10 or 12), box of markers (10 or 12), a deck of cards and a glue stick.
- No-sew fleece blankets. You would purchase 1.5 yards each of a pattern and matching solid fleece. If you decide to make these, we could send you instructions. Some people neglect to put the pattern the right way or don't cut off the manufacturer's edge (called selvage) and then we have to take them apart and start over.?
- A drive for new underwear (kids through adult sizes since some teens wear adult sizes).
 There are some sizes we have plenty of so if you want to do this, we can let you know what those are.
- For Simple Household Needs https://simpleneedsgablog.com/programs/simplehouseholdneeds/ -
- You could do a drive for new or gently used essential household items –for kitchen/bed/bath. There are a lot of essential things someone coming out of homeless needs that can be purchased at the Dollar Tree or elsewhere. The list of what we offer to our clients is attached.
- Or a drive for gently used or new small appliances toasters, crockpots, toaster ovens, DVD players, irons, coffee makers, microwaves, vacuums, floor lamps. Then there are some specific household items we are always low on. Those are: new kitchen trash cans (13 gallon) and gently used or new mattress pads and blankets (twin/full/queen/king).
- New pillows. We always need a lot of pillows!
- One more... we try to have small baby items on hand for clients. Right now, we are low on diapers size newborn, 1, 5 and 6 as well as boys' pullups. These items can be purchased at the Dollar Tree: Pacifiers, baby wash, Baby shampoo, Bottles, Bibs

• Another option is our Comfort Kit program: https://simpleneedsgablog.com/programs/duffel-bags/ You could put together bags of full-size toiletries (you can pick and choose from the list as you'd like). Or do a drive for toiletries that we need and we'll pull them together in the bags (we have bags). We also need 5-item bags of full-size toiletries for the school social workers. Those include shampoo, soap, toothpaste, a toothbrush and deodorant (can be purchased at the Dollar Tree if you'd like).

Simple Needs mission is to meet the simple needs of children, people experiencing homelessness, and others in need, while inspiring our community to do the same. While agencies focused on these vulnerable populations are doing great work, most focus on the basic needs of food, clothing, shelter and job training. SNGA seeks to "fill in the gaps" by meeting other unmet, but important, needs. It is in these simple acts—bringing a tent to a person living in the woods, or providing birthday gifts to a homeless child—that we help connect people with the services that can improve their lives.

Let's place this on our ongoing Collection items: Candles, in particular, are one thing people experiencing homelessness need the most. They use them to see at night and to keep rodents away from their tents. I'll bet you have some candles in your house gathering dust! Please consider donating to our cause. Do you like to do after-Christmas shopping? Candles are often on sale at a great price! The best kind are pillar and tapered.

Keep your eyes peeled for a few gently used items or post this need in your neighborhood facebook or nextdoor neighbor. In March - I'd like to set a goal to collect 10 gently used tents, new pillows, tarps, backpack filled with new socks/underwear, candles, hygiene items.

This is on our list for a February or March project. It will be held on a Tuesday night after work and we will deliver it on a Wednesday.




